- ❖ God has seen it fit by His Divine Providence and Will to permit us to be at *over* 95% of our monthly support.



We are Progressing!

This past week has been a time to reflect and be evaluated; we learned many invaluable tools and were critiqued in how we are learning language. It was a good thing; it was a great time of encouragement as the consultants used their combined decades of experience to help us do this job better.

We appreciated our time with them, beside the linguistic side; we had great fellowship, and were given greater insight on tribes that are ready for missionaries to move into. There are so many tribes asking for missionaries, where do you begin? Luckily we have a team of missionaries doing survey after survey evaluating each of the many things that go into beginning a new work. We were given many names (pray for more missionaries to come and answer the call of these tribes ASKING for missionaries) and as of now, we see about a handful of them surfacing to the top of the list. **Pray for wisdom!**

We have about 6 weeks left (yes, just 6 weeks) at this location, and then we head for about 2 months into a tribe to learn the in's and out's of tribal missions. After that, surveying the many tribes in which God might be preparing us to serve in. That will be closer to July.

We are over a 1/3rd of the way done in our language study for Tok Pisin,

next up, will tribal allocation and team formation, then off to the bush to learn another language and begin the arduous task of literacy, teaching, translation, building believers up into maturity, and then discipleship. We have a big task ahead, but we have a BIG GOD.
